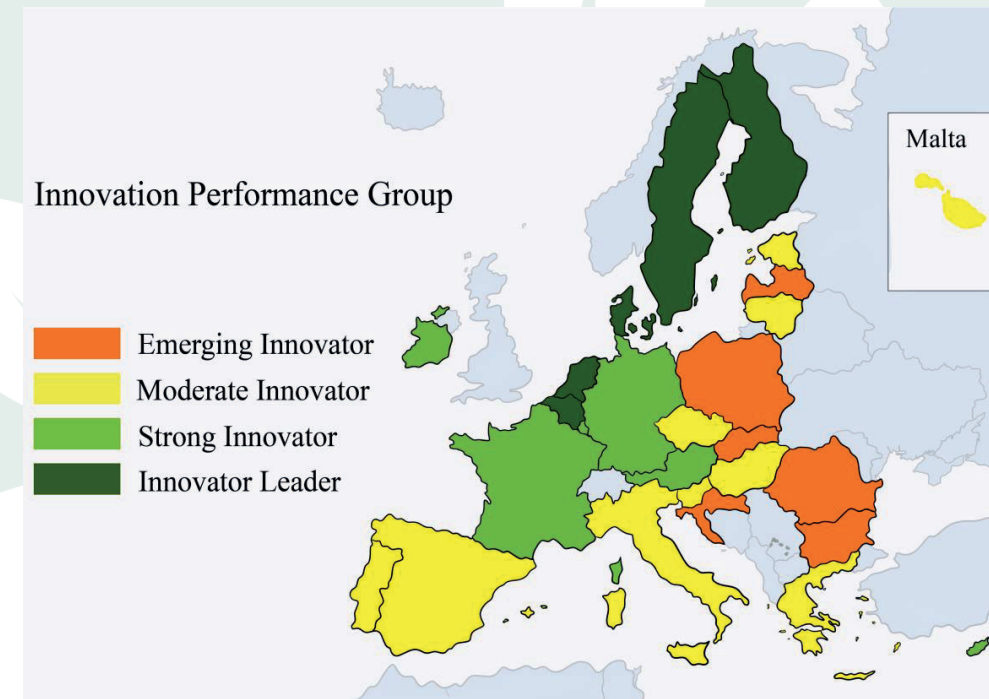
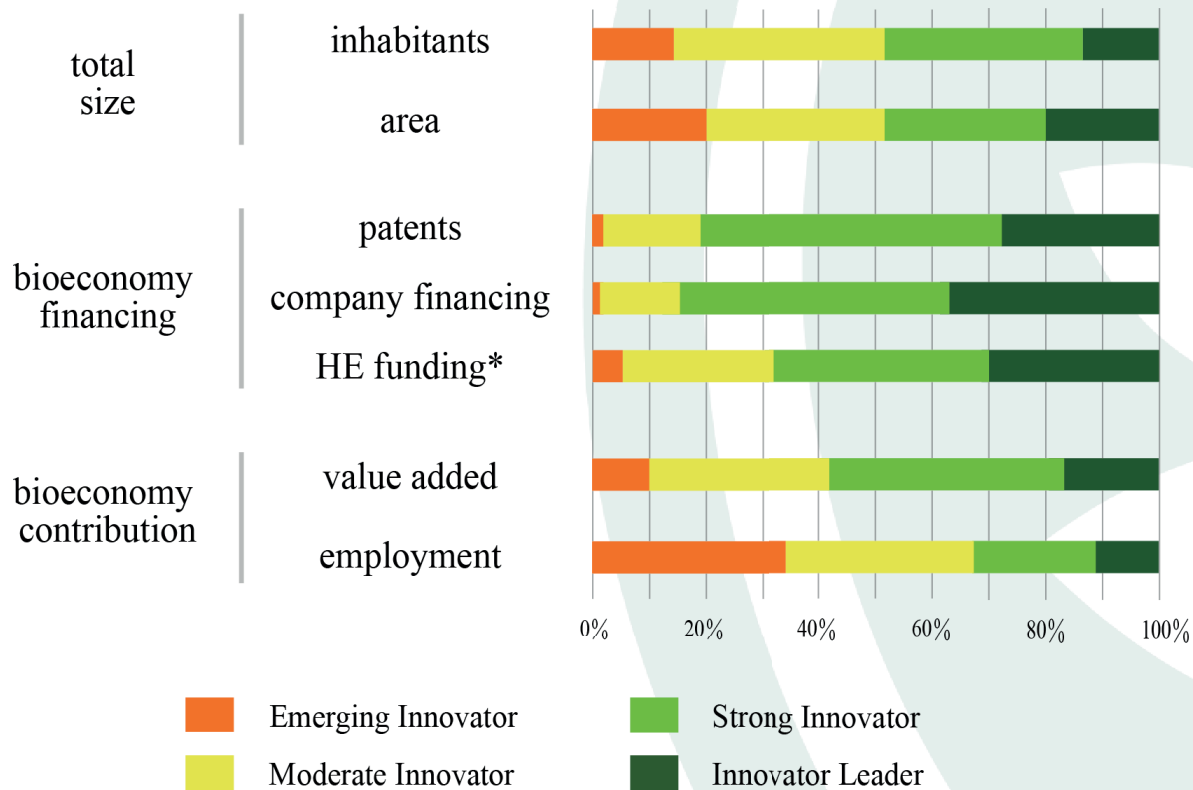

ShapingBio recommendations

- Member states or rural regions with low/medium innovativeness may....
 - make the benefits of bioeconomy more tangible
 - focus on more value from biomass in the countries themselves
 - continue to build up bioeconomy innovation capacities in the countries
 - mostly already started activities to form networks, hubs
 - to develop Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda
 - enhance connections between the different Member States and regions with different innovation profiles, e.g. via partnerships
 - explore unique pathway with regional profile

ShapingBio recommendations

Foster regional engagement:

Regions have a highly important role in the bioeconomy, which will increase in the implementation

- ⇒ EU member states should pay more attention to engagements of their regions in bioeconomy
- ⇒ EC is important for regional funds in regional and should continue this, e.g. with
 - funding systems, such as the Regional Innovation Valleys for Bioeconomy and Food Systems
 - support of collaboration of networks/clusters/hubs as they have important role
 - Support of capacity building in regional administration
 - Fostering Good Practice exchange of various stakeholder groups
